Remember that the child's mother and father cannot for this moment be of support to the child because they have made the decision and are in denial that it is their baby who is dying, but those who pray and wait in reverence accompany the child into the Father's hands. So it's not "time wasted" as one individual tried to forcibly tell me.

The Helpers of God's Precious Infants is a group of men and women of all ages, always outside the abortion facility even if small in numbers they accompany the dying little one. Join them if you can. It is good. Join them so that we can close down this other cruel monstrous place, called Marie Stopes International at a Melbourne suburb called Croydon. A beautiful leafy suburb which has insinuated within it another death chamber....abortion clinic. Read below.

Late Term Abortion at Croydon

I remember saying and writing these words at the time of new abortion laws in Victoria 2008 which freed and decriminalised abortion laws to birth. I wrote this:

"At the moment my heart is broken over this dreadful decision on this Black Friday. A decision which has legalised infanticide. A decision which has made a mummy's womb the most dangerous place on earth. How we go on from here...I don't know"

The abortion clinic in Croydon, Victoria (the same one where many women were recently infected with hepatitis), is again in the news this time over a botched late term abortion. Yes the late term abortions which were meant to be a rarity are indeed happening with gruesome regularity.

Recently, October 24, in our Sunday Age, a notoriously non pro life newspaper, actually reported on a botched late term abortion which nearly left the woman dead and definitely the infant dead. The abortion facility is now run by Marie Stopes International, one of the largest abortion providers in Australia and indeed the world.

The article reported "Dr Schulberg had aborted Ms (name withheld by me) .23-week-old foetus, without anaesthetic, even though she was dangerously ill, unconscious and had no family present." The woman ended up in intensive care at a local hospital, with multiple organ failure. The article then continued with details of the woman and her situation and reason for her seeking the abortion.

The procedure for this abortion was that the woman be given medication to take for 3 days. The day before the abortion she had an appointment where she was found to be dangerously ill, unconscious and alone. Her family thought? Of ringing the ambulance but instead called the abortion facility where they were urged to put the woman in a taxi and take her into the clinic (which they did) where Dr Schulberg went ahead with the abortion despite her serious condition. This Dr Schulberg is the "expert" in late term abortions in Victoria. He kills babies which could live if born premature and its parents want it. This is the infanticide I spoke about three years ago and have been hinting at for years now. We opened the door for this to happen. Slowly, slowly. I even spoke about it in my book which was first released 4 years ago before the new abortion law reforms.

Eventually the clinic called an ambulance to take her to hospital. It's believed that at that stage she was near death. "She is fortunate to be alive - her family call it a 'miracle'."

And this is being actively pro woman? This is what the pro abortion lobby thought was good for their "sisters" This is what they fought so hard for? This is what the women who head Women's Health Victoria and lobbied for open abortion think good for their "sisters?" This is what was supposed to happen in backyards wasn't it? But it happened in a legal, sanitised facility. So the backyard stories what were they?

I was saddened with the whole story which also continued with information that the parents were still awaiting the refund of \$4000 from the clinic. Imagine paying \$4000 to have their child ...you know. I can barely bring myself to write it anymore. Thirty pieces of silver must equal \$4000 in today's exchange.

This story made the headlines because of \$\$\$\$ otherwise we would not have known that another viable infant was terminated.

Imagine in land a land like Australia with its excellent facilities, and social services someone takes a baby of 23 gestation in to die because why? We need weeks protection for women and babies who are in this situation where they think that the only option is the death of baby. But first we need to call on the Victorian government to provide this protection for these women and babies and repeal the monstrous Abortion Law Reform Act.

Please dear readers contact Mr Baillieu, Premier of Victoria, who just the same week as this story emerged, announced that it is introducing tough new laws to protect puppies and cats. Puppies and cats protected (good as that

is) but 23 week infants left to die? And botched abortions leave mothers to almost die?

At the conclusion of the word Amen...there was a palpable silence, and then a tear, and then applause.

International Conference **Counsellors and Psychotherapists**

Again Thank you to Fr Raymond for making it possible for me to attend this conference here in Melbourne where I was able to interact and meet other counsellors and psychotherapists from around Australia and around the world. Report on the March for Babies and 40 days for life

Women on the pill tend to pick 'duds', study claims Reported in the Herald Sun October 13th.


In a recent article in our daily newspaper Herald Sun, (Oct 13thth – Catholic readers note the date!) It was reported that women who take the chemical birth control pill, tend to choose partners who are unsatisfactory although the relationship lasts longer because of the unhindered sexual element of the relationship.

How interesting that the relationship would not have lasted as long had contraception not been there, which seems to me to say that the partners would not be together except that the sexual aspect was readily available and without encumbrances or consequences.

The study also commented that "women who take birth control pills tend to choose as partners, men who are less attractive and unsatisfactory in intimacy area but the men stay longer because of the availability of sex. Studying the effects of contraceptive hormones on choice of partners the researchers questioned 2519 women from various countries (US Czech Rep. Britain, and Canada) who had at least one child each and the participants were asked to rate their relationship for general satisfaction and attractiveness of their partner.

At time of meeting of partner, oral contraceptives had been used by 1005 women whilst 1514 used no hormonal birth control Craig Roberts of Stirling University Scotland, who led the study said that "our results show some positive and negative consequences of using the pill when a woman meets her partner."

Further according to Roberts, "Such women may, on average, be less satisfied with the sexual aspects of their relationship but more so with non-sexual aspects. Overall, women who met their partner on the pill had longer relationships - by two years on average - and were less likely to separate."



Redeeming Grief is a reflection of and study of abortion grief, which is experienced by some women who choose to undergo this elective procedure. reflections are the result of listening to over 1000 personal stories and listening to the expressions used by the women as they spoke about their decision to abort the life of their child. These reflections then attempt to reconstruct the meaning that this procedure has had for the aborting woman and how this one procedure has been the catalyst for life changes.

Redeeming Grief looks at abortion trauma and grief from the spiritual and the psychological perspective. Its influences on the individuals involved and society. It is hoped that the language used is reader friendly and the concepts (both spiritual and psychological) are also reader friendly.

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"Roberts's suspects that birth control pills skew the subconscious "chemistry" by which a woman makes a mating choice."
