Doctor who infected women with Hepatitis C Pleads Guilty to 55 charges of negligently causing serious injury.

Several years ago I wrote in my newsletter about a doctor, who whilst working at a very busy abortion facility had allegedly infected over 50 women with Hepatitis C.

This day November 10, 2012, our daily newspaper *The Herald Sun*, ran with the story on page 2 and showed the history of this doctor James Peters and the tragedy that has been his life and the life of those around him.

However, what really made me angry while reading the news article was the Judge's comment "The victims in this case are a group of the most highly innocent people you could ever come across."

Innocent your honour? How so your honour? I would have thought that the most innocent people in the whole tragic and sad drama are the babies who were taken in to be aborted. They had absolutely no say in the matter. Sad and utterly sorry that I am for the women, and it should never have happened, they *chose* to be there. They chose to go to have a termination of their pregnancy. They are not *the most innocent* members in this issue the *most innocent* are the babies and they did not even rate a mention.

We have heard that some of the infected women were present and in tears, we read about the doctor's medical history of misadventure after misadventure. We heard about the doctor's own wife dying of Hep C. We heard about his own addiction to fentanyl, (an opioid used in general anaesthesia), we heard about the class action being taken by the group of women and the solicitors involved, but we did not hear one word spoken about these 55 and the thousands more babies who died at that abortion clinic and some at his hands. As per usual they are deemed collateral damage.

as I read the story in the paper and no doubt it will be covered by all media outlets, this is a story of great tragedy beginning with a doctor who no doubt started out to be a doctor and "Do no Harm" to become a doctor who himself became addicted to a substance of addiction, to infecting his own wife who has died of the disease(Hep C) who then went on to terminate the lives of countless infants in the womb, to pleading guilty to child pornography, to infecting patients with his own type of disease. It's a tragedy of monumental proportions. Finally this outcome and many deaths.

This is a story of tragedy all around, but unlike His Honour the Judge, involved in the case, I do NOT think or believe that those women presenting to have their baby's life ended were the "most highly innocent people you could ever come across." The most highly innocent were indeed the innocent children themselves who had no one to defend them then and continue to have no one to defend them now. The law is an......

This Judge continued with almost what I could consider a veiled threat when he said that "the women might *wrongly* come under attack or criticism by some in the community which could exacerbate their terrible situation" 55 dead babies your honour. Remember?

I don't know of anyone going to one of the women's

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homes or up to the person herself and threatening or criticising or hurting her or them, I think they will hurt enough as it is. Though they might be quietly covered with unseen prayers, but I refuse to accept His Honour's words that the women in this issue are the most highly innocent. He obviously forgot the babies and if he didn't, then he is playing the politically correct game which is the norm of our time and society.

Effects of Abortion on Society

The effects of abortion on society cannot even begin to be estimated because they are subtle yet multi faceted. Apart from the demographic winter and the loss of future generations which will create the demand for more anti life laws, abortion blunts the woman's maternal instinct and when the woman's maternal instinct is not acute/sharp she ignores or shuns the voice of the child, the echo of the child's voice written on her heart, thus spurning the call to instantly respond to the call of the child and when the child, feeling no warmth or response from the mother, is left with a feeling of loss, then rebels against this loss and violence erupts and becomes a normal in life. Today we have the young who are violent to one another and to elders.

Abortion removes benevolence from the world and society because the feminine has been encouraged to permit violence to be done to her own feminine self which has inscribed in it an attraction towards life and in turn puts in place false, absent or diluted response. There is found no "agape" love in the one who aborts because this kind of love demands the type of "self giving love" a movement from nothing to something. Abortion is a movement from "Agape" (love) to nothing to death. The antithesis of all that is good.

In Victoria, Australia, we have recently been privy to an interesting experience. The tragic and violent death of the young woman Gillian Meagher brought out in our citizens an unusual response.

Through the media we followed her disappearance to eventual discovery of her body, and then the offender's capture through intense media coverage. Why was this? Was this because it was a murder? Well there are murders of young men and women reported daily in all our all media outlets local and from all around the world. Was it because she was young and beautiful? All the other murdered young men and women are beautiful especially to their families and loved ones and friends. Was it because she worked within the media industry? Perhaps.

But I would like to ask why 30,000 people marched for "Peace in the suburbs" where this beautiful young lady died. Was it to say "no more this has to stop? We need to feel safe in our city and our society?" Perhaps. But then I thought how can this come about? How can 30,000 people march for safer streets but NOT ONE marched when we heard that there were over 60 babies born alive as a result of abortion and left to die without assistance? Why does violence surprise us?

Why didn't these same 30,000 marching individuals hear the cry or whimper of the babies and say "no more we cannot allow this monstrosity to continue. We are meant to be a civilised society. We do not let children die alone or kill them" Why didn't this happen? Is it because abortion is covered and protected by law? But the babies in question were external to the mother's body and were alive and were "patients" in their own right, so why was there not a huge outcry and march over these 55 or more deaths of infants born alive that we know about?

What was different about the young woman who died through being murdered...no different except a matter of size. The woman, Gillian Meagher a young adult, married, beautiful and visible.

The babies who were aborted and would have lived if given help were invisible. That's the only difference and perhaps another difference was that Gillian Meagher was wanted and the babies were unwanted and the whimper of their voices was unheard by the 30,000 who marched, or those in the medical profession who stood by and allowed this to happen; or babies parents who demanded that right that their child Or even by Judges who refuse to even acknowledge their existence and their plight whilst seemingly "comforting" and calling "innocent" those who took their child to the abortion facility.

I don't believe that those who marched changed anything except make news headlines for a few days. And the babies will continue to die to 40 weeks and there won't be 30,000 marching in their memory because the feminist and pro choice and pro abortion lobbies have demanded the "right" to be able to make

this kind of death happen. And this because the blunting of the human feminine heart has accomplished. It's the only way it could happen.



The Constitutional Court of South Korea delivers a ruling in favour of the right to life of the fœtus

In a recent article sent to me by a reader (thanks John). It was reported that the Consitutional Court of South Korea delivered a ruling in favour of the right to life of the fœtus. The ruling (23rd August 2012) stated that the right to life is the most fundamental of human right and that the right of the woman to have control over her body could not invoked to over rule the right to life of a fœtus.

This was an astonishing ruling and perhaps caution is advised because South Korean law defines the beginning of life at implantation which then gives a certain freedom for expérimentation on the human

embryo and IVF experimentation.

Further, the South Korean law on This law passed in 1973 actually legalises abortion. According to this law, abortion is authorised legal to 24 weeks of pregnancy especially in the case of rape, incest, or fœtal abnormality or if the mother's life is considered to be in danger by carrying on with the pregnancy. There are many flaws in this law which are untenable to us. When life begins for us is at conception and not at implantation, and the fact that really abortion is condoned to 24 weeks, not outright, and with some limitations but abortion is an abortion irrespective of the conditions and limitations.

However, I want to say that to read a headline which said "Constitutional Court of Korea delivers a ruling in favour of the right to life of the foetus" and that "life" is the most fundamental of human rights and that the right of a woman to have control of her body could not be involved to overrule the right to life of a foetus" made for good reading.

We need more of these headlines including one which we hope to see here in Australia especially Victoria with the worst abortion law second only to China with its one child policy, which might say "most brutal abortion law in Australia has been repealed" This is the headline worth looking forward to and working towards.

Is there some hope? Maybe. With the above information can we see a glimmer of hope that the lunacy which has been the abortion ride might come to an end? That it might be seen for what it is and that is that it is the killing of infants in the womb, and who are also present citizens and the future of every nation and who have as much a right to "life" as the women carrying the children.

Will the global disordered rage against the unborn child be exposed for what it is? Maniacal. Let's hope.

Abortion and the culture of death, the culture of selfism, me-ism is the antithesis of the culture of life and love. Love says, "I offer myself for you, for your good" Abortion and anti life says "you die because I don't want you."


The Year that's Been

In June I did three talks to groups. Also in June I also presented a paper on post abortion grief to the Counselling Queensland Association annual conference. This was to a group of counsellors.

Late July diagnosed with breast cancer and the barrage of tests and more tests and first surgery and then later second surgery and few weeks of recovery from surgery and meetings with oncologists/radiologists, surgeons and so many other ologists I can't remember them.

In late August attendance at a conference in Geelong on Grief & Loss in contemporary society. important to attend these because I have my say on abortion grief and slowly more and more secular professionals are beginning to hear and accept and speak about the grief that they see in their practices. Post abortion grief needs to move from "Church only Care" because when a doctor has a grieving/hurting depressed patient he/she will first refer to a recognised registered, psychologist, psychiatrist, counsellor and not be thinking about the religious aspect of the grief or mental health issue. This needs to be dealt with by the counsellor. Also it could be seen that abortion grief is only a "religious" matter which it is not. There have been some who have tried to make abortion grief a "response to religious upbringing" but non religious women and males grieve copiously as you have read in testimonies from my girls. September attended workshop on self destructive anger and its management. This assisted me with information my male clients especially. This month (September) I was also accepted into the Australian Counselling Association College of Loss and Grief at Level 3 (second highest level) Member. Further, I applied for, and have been upgraded and accepted as a Specialist Grief Counsellor again Level 3. Specialising in abortion and sexual abuse counselling.

October attended conference in Milan (see this newsletter). November spoke at a Catholic College to year 10-11 boys, and beginning first November through to mid December 6 weeks of daily radiotherapy which will be followed by a break through Christmas and then begin hormone (cancer) treatment for 5 years.

Throughout these particular activities I have continued to counsel my clients and indeed took on board 4 new ones and I have to say that I have the best clients because they have walked slowly with me and not one left because of my medical and hospital needs.
