A great tragedy

Dear friends, since the last issue of the newsletter went out, and on Easter Sunday, in a real life horror story brought to our screen and news services, we were told of the murder of two little girls allegedly by their father. What horror on a day that should be one of glory.

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When I heard and listened stunned and in horror at that breaking news and its details I was reminded of another recent murder of young boy Luke Batty in front of his mother and friends (by his father) of a little girl called Darcy Freeman (4 yrs old) tossed over a bridge (father) to her death, of the 3 Farquaharson children 10,7 and 2 yrs old (father) and other names written in our inglorious history. Why? Why? Why so much violence against the most innocent and trusting and loving? Why?

Have we become so desensitised that it has become possible not to feel? That the first answer to a difficulty is murder of innocence?

And I have to say ... yes.

First of all we have created a society where innocence is murdered legally...abortion. Murder of innocence (abortion) is spoken about nonchalantly and so matter of fact that slowly it has become what I have always spoken about and wrote about and feared "normal." I have said in interview many times we are in danger of making abortion "normal" and following that all death of innocence newsworthy for two days on prime time TV then onto next and newer story. We have made death ho hum, "normal"

We are heading towards a society where innocence sick, elderly, incapacitated can be murdered legally. Belgium legalised euthanasia for children Feb 14th, 2014, "unwanted" life is not tolerated and can in fact be thought of as disposed of at will. We have slowly created a society that speaks of murder using sanitised language and "concerned language" so that no imagery is formed in the mind, and then we wonder why atrocities happen.

Abortion up to full term is violence and nothing other than infanticide and death of a child and legal. Yet the media is deathly silent about the matter.

Euthanasia is violence against another child or adult or weakened person and is now making inroads and in places legal and thus giving this type of "legalised murder" respectability. Why?

Because it is feared or perhaps even thought that the suffering person will suffer excessively. But who is it who will suffer excessively? The ailing one or the one watching and waiting? Like Peter, James and John (Mt 26:40) we want to go to sleep and not wait, watch and pray because it's too hard, so better to "sleep."

Women don't want to give hospitality to a child for only a number of days so it can be born alive and then donate (if not wanted) as a gift to other loving parents who have prayed and longed for a child. It's the "me" mentality" which has changed society and which brings great suffering to all.

Why are we scandalised and horrified when a sense of rage is played out visibly in our society as was the case of the murder of the mentioned children. Only because these events have been brought to our screens and to our vision by the media and so we can see visually the horrors. Abortion and its brutalisation of the child serenely growing in its supposed safe place (mother's womb) is hidden by the same media. I think its called covert compliance.

This same media which will make much about these child murders will not bring to vision a dismembered child. This apparently will disturb the sensitivities of viewers and bring into question the "rightness" and "efficacy" and "right" which is demanded re the abortion issue. Will bring into question the lie told that what is growing in the womb is not a child but some unrecognizable bunch of matter or clump of genetic product. And in a society like ours which is supposed so advanced this is bought not because there is no evidence but because it is convenient to believe the lie.

We have a violent society. We have assisted this society to become violent because we have Okayed violence beginning with the youngest to the eldest and those (like Hitler) who are thought to be not "quite right." We have said that only those of a certain size can be recognized and so the media brings to us to view on screen horrors which they deem newsworthy and not others which are deemed as "rights."

Indeed we have a violent society, one which we have created with our demands, laws, visuals, games and above all loss of God, inner peace, and knowledge of right and wrong. We are reaping what we have sown.

According to Pope Francis, recently "For a Christian, it is part of the witness of the Gospel to protect life with courage and love in all its stages." (April 11, All its stages and not 2014.) when the media deem newsworthy to show us.

For those of us who are at the forefront of pro life work we need to remember that the media will not help us and we need to remember that each of us is a walking Gospel. Each of us every time we defend a life in whatever way, the Gospel is

spoken in word and action. Every time we defend life we speak the word "Amen" as God's representative.

There is no excuse for being coy and we should not be afraid to call life, "life" because we know that it is life from conception and a spark of God. And we know that so many good people get involved in protection of the animal species, yet the human being in the image of God is tossed away in some bucket or as medical waste or sold as experimental material.

We have no excuse. We know what is happening but choose to remain silent.

Weeping tears of Sorrow and Regret

Since the last issue of the newsletter I have had a visit to my office from one of the girls whom I have helped not only not to have an abortion but have walked with her as she continued her pregnancy.

At the beginning of our relationship together I asked her if I could place her on prayer list and get her involved with others and she said "no please Anne in case someone reads it and knows its me" and so I respected her wishes but you have prayed for her I know.

Well she has had her baby, a little girl some months ago and one day recently came in with her beautiful bundle to introduce her to me and she was so happy and I was so happy holding baby. It was a time of beauty and silence.

During our time together about an hour, we spoke about her coping and family's relationship with baby

> (very happy though when first told of pregnancy told her to abort, now very happy with their granddaughter).

> But I could see that something was troubling her. Her voice quivered at times. She looked lovingly at the baby, I was assured she was managing well and baby was doing all the right things. Financially she was OK, so all seemed to be as it should.

But still the "counsellor" in me


could see something was amiss.

In time the baby needed to be breast fed and she asked if she could do this "of course you can" and as she started to feed the infant the tears rolled and rolled and rolled down her face onto the baby's face. I was reminded of the Mother of Jesus holding him in her arms dead Son and her tears washing his face.

I waited for a time to let this happen and then asked her what the tears were about.

"Anne I nearly aborted her I don't deserve her maybe God will take her away from me because I wanted to abort her. I'm afraid to even sleep because what if she dies because I wanted to abort her. I love her so much. I can't believe that I wanted to abort her."

And of course I then understood why she came in to my office and I am so glad that she did and I am so glad that she has allowed me to be part of her life and the baby's life.



We were able to speak about her fears and that they were real but not to believe them, and I was able to assure her that God doesn't work like that. That He has loved her and trusted her with the life of this little one and to fully and completely enjoy all the years they will share together.

This, dear friends is not the first time I have heard the same words spoken or seen the tears flowing over the baby. These tears are the tears of healing, the tears which led me to call my book Redeeming Grief because these are the tears shed in sorrow not even over what was done but even over what was momentarily considered. Indeed these are redeeming and healing tears. These are the tears of regret and sacredness.

It has been suggested that if a woman continues to weep over her aborted child then she is "not healed." This is utter rubbish (its been publicly said of me too). We weep because of affectional bonds which a mother has to her baby/ies (like miscarried/stillbirth who are never forgotten) and even to think that she might have harmed her little one brings the tears, this shows how deep the bonds are etched into her heart. Confirming the words of Is 49:15 can a mother forget the baby at her breast?" Even if this was possible and God says no it is not possible, then He will not forget the child.

Even when a mum has to stand by when her baby is sick and she feels helpless and would rather it was she herself was sick. So too when a mother has aborted her baby or even thought about aborting her baby then the memory of the thought causes anguish. When a woman aborts her baby she cannot forget what's written in her being. She has aborted "mothering" but not her being a "mother." Or "motherhood."

For this mother in front of me the thought that she tentatively considered at the beginning of the pregnancy that abortion might be an option, now looking into the face of her beautiful baby brings an ache unknown by another unless they have experienced the same. This is a Mum's right to feel. For me seeing these tears and being able to be of help is the great joy of my work.

Dear friends what led me to write about this event is a letter I received and which is printed in letters page. It's beautiful and confirms what I know and have seen, and what needs to happen is to try and encourage all health professionals not to think "abortion" as a first option when an inconvenient pregnancy occurs,

because even the word has the power to come back to

I have in past issues of newsletter written about abortion for foetal abnormality and my heartfelt desire that abortion is not offered to the hurting parents. To offer alternatives. To encourage the parents to hold onto their child as long as the child lives. To tell it a million times how much it is loved and welcomed. To do all things in a short time given to them so that that child's journey in this life will have meant something.

The option for abortion simply says to the parents of a disabled and dying child and child short to live that their child is not worth much and to dispose of it quickly. For whose benefit? The parents will grieve either way. So why not allow the infant to be born and with great dignity and love have his/her life story acknowledged and recorded? And a burial worthy of a human being from heaven be given.

Perhaps the reason we cannot do this is because we have become a disposable society. We dispose of what is inconvenient and unwanted including human beings.

We have much to answer for.

Activism v Counselling

Dear friends, I have often been asked why I don't make more political statements, make more political comments, take political stand. I have thought about this and my answer has to be that I am first and foremost a post abortion grief counsellor. I deal with the aftermath of the event of the abortion. I cannot wear two hats, that is activist and counsellor, that is, a qualified counsellor, I need to stand back and help to heal.

Where possible I will make a comment, write letters to editor (though never published) write submissions and even when the abortion laws were being proposed for reform in 2008 I sent submission to the Law Reform Commission and wrote to key parliamentarians but it is not my better work. The best work which I do is to work slowly, methodically, gently to change the belief and outlook of one who is hurting and believes after abortion that she is "worthless" and That I think is my work.


I also believe that the Lord is sending me different kinds of clients which frighten me a little, those with early childhood sexual abuse in their history. This frightens me because no one wants to hear about such A disgusting topic but with marvellous gentle work, non judgemental work, non rushed work, even these wounds can be healed. I have seen that with the Lord nothing is impossible.

I speak about this because it has been suggested that I should be doing more to help pro life politicians and get out there and be "loud" because I know the reality of what abortion does. I have taken this criticism on board and still I think that my best work is the one where I have seen someone come to me broken and leave saying thank you Anne I'm ok.

There are others who marvellous political activists and I am not worthy to tie their shoe laces, but frankly I wouldn't send a fly to them for counselling even for all their good intentions. We have a need to know what we are called to do and then allow Him to use us with the gifts and talents he has given to us.

My heart looks into the heart of a hurting one, even deeply into years past and be able to see where the poisoned seed lies and slowly extricate this seed without causing further hurt. If I tried this with politicians I am sure they would think I need some help myself. Mind you there have been a few times when I knew I could help several of them. ©

A New Research

Recently (Thursday May 8) in one of our daily papers a very small article appeared deeply embedded within this erudite tome. The article spoke about scientists confirming that not only does a baby attuned brain exist but it really and truly has a purpose! And guess what? Dear Anne

Just to let you know I am happy to receive further newsletters by email instead of mail. Thank you for the newsletter. I appreciate and admire the depth and breadth with which you consider this whole issue- for the individual and society at large. This was very evident in Redeeming Grief.

I have not gotten around to writing previously but there have been a number of issues of the newsletter where I have thought about writing to you to show support- particularly where you have touched a raw nerve for other readers who found what you were saying was distasteful.

I did love the last newsletter with the letter from Tendi to her baby Ishmael. It was very moving and showed how much work she had done with you to have reached the point of expressing herself with such love and clarity amidst the pain.

I did want to mention to you a story of someone I know who was very distressed at having considered abortion for her baby who had a terminal illness. The mother was pressuredby family and her doctor - and for 2 terrible days she did consider aborting (she was told to "set your religious beliefs aside"). She decided not to abort. The baby's illness followed its natural course and he did die in utero some months later. The thing is in spite of her natural distress that her baby died, when she told me her story, the overwhelming focus was her trauma and shock that she had even considered abortion. Doctors actually need to be aware of the impact of even suggesting abortion to a patient as this could have longer term ramifications even if the patient does not go through with the abortion. I have not seen this aspect of the topic discussed elsewhere but I am sure it is an issue as there is pressure on doctors to offer patients "options". There is also probably very little permission for women to express their dismay or offence at being offered such options.

As a newly trained counsellor, I am very pleased to hear that you are giving talks at conferences etc as I think changing the culture amidst the counselling profession is another arm of cultural change on this whole topic.

May God continue to bless your work and those who engage with you in the courageous process of coming to terms with the impact of such a life changing choice in their lives...

Crying After Abortion.

In a Recent discussion with a midwife who has worked in a hospital where abortions are carried out, the question was posed to me "Anne why don't the women cry before they go into? Why do they burst into tears when they are roused from anaesthesia? Why didn't they let us know before that they don't want this to happen?"

My answer had to be "because before the abortion (for whatever the reason) they were holding on to their very breath. They couldn't let go because for them to be there had to be something urging forward to have the abortion. Something or someone making her abort even if it was her own choice for career or other functional purposes, she had to hold onto her "self" in order to be able to proceed with what she thought had to be done.

After the abortion it's almost like exhaling. It's done and suddenly the reality hits home and a turning into a foetal position and wanting to be left alone. This is a normal. I have heard it many times. The "foetal position" is simply for her a return to her own need for comfort for infancy, curling, because she is hurting.

What this requires of those attending to the girl/woman is gentleness because at this moment she feels the most terrible pain possible.

For those girl/women who say "problem over" this is the ambivalence often spoken about but this is temporary. It's a realisation that whatever issues the pregnancy would have caused are suddenly gone but then comes the night time, the alone time, the thinking time. So for this woman for whom all seems now problem free, also gentleness please.
